Adults £1.80 single, £3.60 return or 'CitySaver.'

Between Moulsecomb (The Avenue) and Stanmer Park it is £1 single (bus 78 only). There is free travel for anyone using the bus for local travel only within Stanmer Park itself.

Children Up to 2 children (under 16) go free when travelling with an adult on bus 78. BUS ID or ID+ holders travel for 50p each way. Other children (5-13 only) pay half fare.

National Buss Pass holders travel free.

'**SuperSaver**' tickets are issued and accepted. They are valid for unlimited travel on all buses on services 77, 78 and 79 – and on most services operated by Brighton & Hove Bus Co. If also going to Ditchling Beacon/Devil's Dyke you'll need to buy a SuperSaver (£5 if paying on the bus).

Rail Tickets Show a rail ticket(s) valid to Brighton or Hove and get **two 78 bus tickets for the price of one**, or a **third off** an individual ticket (except 'Savers').

Day 'Explorer' tickets are valid for free travel.

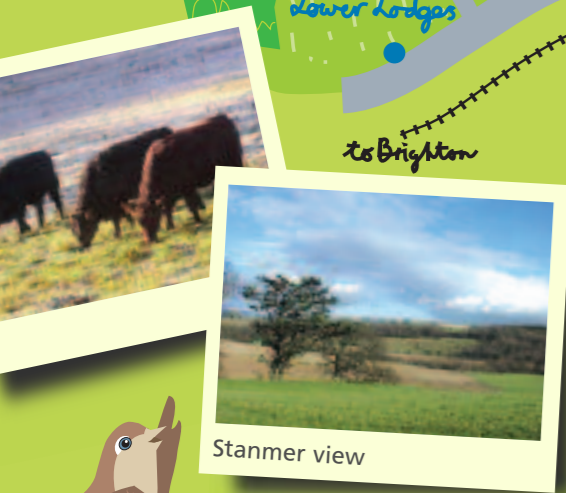


About Stanmer

Its history The park has been shaped by human activity for 5000 years. In the 18th century the Pelham family bought and landscaped the park and built Stanmer House.

Its buildings Stanmer House is an impressive restored building. The church and pond opposite create a beautiful park setting. There is a cafe and accessible public toilets in Stanmer Village. Please respect the privacy of the residents of the village.

Its natural beauty The park makes up part of a nationally important landscape known as the Sussex Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB). The park woodland is particularly attractive in the spring when bluebells carpet the floor.

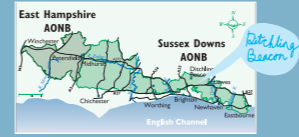
